Geriatric Care Management

- Coordinate medical appointments and services
- Facilitate communication between patients, physicians and families
- Provide RN's to accompany patients to medical appointments
- Assist with medication management
- Provide ongoing monitoring
- Act as a liaison between family members and the older adult

Geriatric Assessments and Referrals

- Perform geriatric assessments to identify problems and provide solutions and referrals

- Arrange for driving evaluations by professionals specializing in older driver safety assessments
- Review medical, legal and financial issues

Hospital Discharge Planning

- Meet with hospital discharge planners
- Evaluate the home care setting and arrange for necessary support services
- Arrange for medical equipment in the home
- Accompany patients home from the hospital
- Obtain new prescriptions and review medication protocol

Did you know...

...that using those closest to us as **informal family caregivers** costs more than you think?

The average **loss in total wealth** due to their care giving responsibilities is more than **\$650,000** over their lifetime.

They spend more than **\$19,000 in out-of-pocket expenses** (including food, transportation and medications), in order to help the care recipient.

Family caregivers spend an average of **8 years caring for their loved one**.

40% of surveyed informal caregivers reported that **care giving affected their ability to advance on the job**.

They start out providing **small amounts of care which inevitably increases** beyond their expectations.

This care giving often **takes a toll on their own health** and personal relationships.
